



SIDNEY J. & IRENE *Shipman* SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1995 through a bequest from the estate of Dr. Sidney J. Shipman (AB 1917, MD 1919) and Irene Shipman

PURPOSE:

The Shipman Scholarships provide merit scholarships to talented prospective undergraduate students admitted to the University of Michigan.

ELIGIBILITY:

Prospective students with high academic achievement who have been admitted as first-year undergraduates will be nominated for consideration through the admissions process. Academic achievement is determined on the basis of a set standard of high school grade point average and SAT/ACT test scores. Exceptional talent in the arts and sciences is considered in the nomination process.

AWARDS:

Fifty students are invited to attend the Shipman Weekend and enroll at the University of Michigan:

- Fifteen students are chosen through the Shipman Weekend interview process for the Sidney and Irene Shipman Scholarship. This scholarship awards approximately \$15,000 a year for four years of undergraduate study, plus room and board (valued at approximately \$8,590 a year). The total award value of this scholarship is approximately \$94,000.
- The 35 remaining students are awarded the Shipman Society Scholarship in the amount of \$7,500 per year. This scholarship has an award value of \$30,000 over four years of undergraduate study.

Additional Benefits:

- The opportunity to live in the Shipman House in South Quadrangle Residence Hall or in a residence hall in the North Campus community
- Membership in the Shipman Society student organization
- Fall welcome reception with senior faculty and administrators

NUMBER:

Fifty Shipman Scholarships are awarded annually.

TENURE:

Four years maximum

DEADLINES:

Prospective nominees must be admitted to the University of Michigan no later than February 1. Recipients are notified by April 4.

SELECTION:

A committee of University of Michigan faculty and administrators selects the Shipman Scholarship finalists and awards the scholarships.
