PENELOPE W. AND E. ROE
SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 through the generosity of Penelope W. and E. Roe Stamps

PURPOSE:

The Stamps Scholarship was established to provide merit scholarships to the brightest and most outstanding undergraduate students admitted to the University of Michigan.

ELIGIBILITY:

Prospective students with high academic achievement who have been admitted as first-year undergraduates are nominated for consideration through the admissions process. Academic achievement is determined on the basis of a set standard of high school grade point average and SAT/ACT test scores. Exceptional talent in the arts and sciences is also considered in the nomination process.

AWARD:

\$40,000 (\$10,000 per year for four years of undergraduate study)

Additional Benefits:

- Membership in the Stamps Scholar Society student organization
- Special opportunities to participate in study abroad, internship, and career development programs
- Fall welcome reception with senior faculty and administrators
- An annual dinner with the scholarship donors, Penelope W. and E. Roe Stamps

NUMBER:

Eighteen Stamps Scholarships are awarded annually.

TENURE:

Four years maximum

DEADLINE:

Prospective nominees should be admitted to the University of Michigan no later than February 1. Recipients are notified by April 1.

SELECTION:

A committee of University of Michigan faculty and administrators selects the Stamps Scholarship recipients each year.

RENEWABILITY:

Scholarship recipients must enroll full-time and make satisfactory academic progress toward an undergraduate degree. This award, when combined with other awards the scholar receives, cannot exceed the University's established cost of attendance each year.
